







KEY FINDINGS:

- The pace of labor rulemaking in the waning months of the Obama presidency will easily exceed that of the previous three two-term presidencies.
- On average, the Obama administration's Department of Labor (DOL) finalized nearly twice as many major labor regulations per year than the previous four administrations.
